A Call to Action for the Willing

The term willingness perfectly characterizes our thought today. This attitude developed gradually as we transitioned over the past seven years from Overlook House, an inpatient Christian Science nursing facility, to the visiting service named Upward Wing.

Willingness

- 1: inclined or favorably disposed in mind
- 2: prompt to act or respond
- 3: done, borne, or accepted by choice or without reluctance

Miriam Webster's Dictionary

As our understanding of the Church Manual provision¹ authorizing Christian Science nursing grew, the Overlook House corporate structure and our practice of Christian Science nursing necessarily changed. We have come to learn that there is no destination to this journey, only continued unfoldment. Now willingness has become our way of life. Following Mrs. Eddy's counsel, we strive to "be sure that God directs (our) way; then, hasten to follow under every circumstance."2

So diving deeper into this word, consider Definition 1. It indicates that willingness is a quality of mind. To illustrate, consider the decision by members of your church to contribute money to a Christian Science organization. A majority vote would not necessarily mean that you were a willing supporter of it. True willingness requires individual choice.

Definition 2 adds a second dimension - prompt action. Think of the individual's acceptance of the majority decision described above as a seed. We do not enjoy the fruit of a seed until it develops into activity. In other words, we must put our willingness into practice by doing something ourselves.

Definition 3 adds the final condition, that we are to undertake our individual actions without reluctance. This suggests that we complete our tasks with joy, eagerness and the expectation of an outcome that will bless not just one, but all.

This discussion is relevant, not just for Overlook House, but for every Christian Science organization that we deem worthy of our support. For too long there has been a tendency to "set it, then forget it."

We have come to learn that a successful organization does not stay in one place too long. It continues to evolve. Successful organizations bring new ideas to the forefront regularly. They refresh by re-engaging willing supporters at regular intervals. True willingness requires each individual to carry a share of the mission by taking some form of prompt action. Finally, instead of addressing continuing dialogue with a sense of burden, the willing individual deports themselves as Mrs. Eddy advises. "The nurse should be cheerful, orderly, patient, full of faith, -- receptive to Truth and Love." 3

In coming months Overlook House is going to address the Christian Science field with some significant change recommendations that may include:

· Licensing our back-office software to other visiting Christian Science nursing services so that they can reduce the amount of money they spend on administration and devote more of their funds to patient services.

- Expanding of our geographic service area through affiliation or merger with other visiting Christian Science nursing services under our financial model of economic self-sufficiency. This may prevent services in those locations from closing.
- Relocating our present undersized and hard-toaccess inventory and storage space from a month-tomonth lease in the Alcazar building, to a new central location that we might build, purchase, or lease.
- Expanding upon the idea above, potentially constructing a dual purpose building that could also become a small in-patient facility. It would be limited to no more than two beds. The intent would be to meet 24-hour care needs locally for periods of seven days or less.

Care Committee Workshop

Members of Christian Science churches in northern Ohio may have noticed a visitor to their services this summer. The Christian Science nurses of Upward Wing are "enlarging their tents" by embarking on a mission to re-introduce themselves, and the services of Upward Wing, to all Christian Scientists in our service area. We are happy to meet the Care Committee chairmen, as well as other members, of every church. This fall we are planning to meet again at a workshop for Care Committees, as well as other interested church members. The details of this workshop will be sent to Care Committees this summer.

Home Helper Class

Christian Scientists in Ohio and in nearby states have an opportunity to "enlarge their tents" by inviting up to six Scientists to attend a Home Helper Class. The Christian Science nurses of Upward Wing conducted several of these classes last year at sites throughout Greater Cleveland and we look forward to expanding our reach even more.

The Home Helper Class is a 10-hour, 2-day class, hosted at a private home. It is designed to enable the student to assist someone living at home with his or her daily needs while supporting Christian Science healing. The story of the Good Samaritan is our guidepost. A former participant in the class succinctly summed up the class when asked what she liked best about the sessions. "The metaphysics, because it takes away the fear that comes with trying to fix or help matter. What freedom when humbly remembering God is there, and there is no mortal problem."

The Board of Upward Wing participates in annual continuing education in Christian Science nursing. Each year the Christian Science nurses of Upward Wing lead a session at one of the board meetings to familiarize the trustees about an aspect of Christian Science nursing. This year the board is "enlarging the place of their tent" by learning more about the Christian Science nurse's skill of cleansing and bandaging, as well as the metaphysical basis for this care.

Prayerful Thoughts on Willingness

What is willingness? It is a quality of both heart and attitude. This being true, it is imperative that we know where we are putting our heart and with what we are aligning our attitude.

Jesus spoke plainly when he said, "where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matt. 6: 21).

What is our treasure? What is it that we love more than anything? If we are following Jesus' example, we are loving God, and trusting in God in all ways and all things and all events.

During this time, we have become more aware of our individual responsibility for making the necessary provisions for caring for ourselves. There have been workshops regarding Medicare, Insurance, and Advance Directives sponsored by Christian Science Nursing organizations across the country, where important information has been shared that is helping us to navigate through the many choices and decisions. It's so important that we remember that spiritual healing through Christian Science is for the world. In a recent article by Robin Hoagland titled "The Vastness of Christian Science" (July 2016 Christian Science Journal) we are reminded that:

Based on the success of her own practice and that of her students, Mary Baker Eddy proved Christian Science is able to address the spectrum of health-care needs. She affirms: "There are various methods of treating disease, which are not included in the commonly accepted systems; but there is only one which should be presented to the whole world, and that is the Christian Science which Jesus preached and practised and left to us as his rich legacy" (Science and Health, p. 344).
